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THE CITY

The River Danube flows right through the heart of Budapest and thus creates a point of reference for visitors who are either on the old cobbled streets on the Buda side, or in the 19th century boulevards on the Pest side. Your interests will decide on which side of the Danube you will spend most of your time. Anyone interested in history will find it difficult to tear oneself away from Buda, where the Palace summit creates an atmosphere of medieval Budapest. Shopaholics will very soon be enticed by the other side of the river where the shops and nightlife compete for everyone's attention.

Budapest is really the fusion of three towns, Buda, Óbuda and Pest. Back in 106 AD, the Romans founded the city of Aquincum in the north-east corner of the Danube. Several changes of population later, at the end of the 9th century, the Magyars arrived. They were descended from a Finnish-Ugrian tribe with roots in Siberia. The Magyar city, with its palace and ring-wall, came to be called Buda, and Aquincum was later called Óbuda. The other side of the river was also settled, in the area which would later be called Pest.

Having been invaded by the Turks - and later by the Austrian army - in 1867 Hungary was elevated to an equal partner in the Austro-Hungarian double monarchy. Budapest became one of the most important ports on the Danube and soon also an industrial centre.

The Jewish quarter on the Pest side is one of the largest in Europe, the first Jewish settlers arrived in the 13th century in Budapest. This is where the Main Synagogue is located, the largest in the world outside of New York. There is a Jewish museum beside the synagogue.

Budapest, together with Vienna, is an international capital of opera. The beautiful State Opera, completed in 1884, is worth a visit even if you are not interested in listening to opera. If you do like opera, you must book in good time and be prepared for a festive occasion.

Buda Hills

On a clear day you should take the tram or bus to Buda Hills, via the cog railway. Here you will find peace and calm high above the city, with a magnificent view from János-hegy.

At the same time make sure to visit some of the caves that are open to the public. In the Pálvölgy cave, among other things, you can see the unique dripstone figures "The Elephant" and "Crocodile". The air in the caves is said to be good for respiratory infections.

Memento Park (Szoborpark Múzeum)

Here you will find one of Budapest's most remarkable attractions. When the proletarian dictatorship's enormous monuments and statues were no longer politically correct – after 1989-90 – they were moved from their conspicuous locations in the centre to a suburb of Buda.

Here – in this "Communist theme park" – among other things, is the gigantic statue of Lenin and Cubist statues of Marx and Engels.

St Stephen's Basilica (Szent István Bazilika)

St. Stephen's Basilica is the largest church in Budapest and can hold up to 8,500 people inside. It is dedicated to Hungary's first king St Stephen and contains his mummified right hand, a much revered treasure.

City Park (Városliget)

The City Park is a popular venue no matter the season; at spring there is a peaceful lake here perfect to walk around or simply enjoy the sight of, as you have a picnic in the grass. The Vajdahunyad castle lies in the background and enhances the gorgeous view even more. There is also the possibility to rent a paddle boat and spend some time on the lake.

In winter time the lake is transformed into an ice rink and people gather here to skate, eat and socialize. If you don't have skates with you you can rent them.

Chain Bridge (Széchenyi Lánchíd)

The Chain Bridge was built out of stone in the middle of the 19th century, connecting Buda and Pest. Each summer there is a festival called "the Summer on the Chain Bridge" - at this time only pedestrians are allowed and there are exciting events happening on the weekends.

Central Market Hall (Központi Vásárcsarnok)

The Central Market Hall (Központi Vásárcsarnok), aka the Great Market Hall, is the largest indoor market in Budapest and it provides a golden opportunity to buy fresh fruit, meat, fish and vegetables. It is divided into three floors, and if you're looking for Hungarian souvenirs, you should try the second floor.

Hungary has suffered through not one, but two terror regimes; the fascist and the Stalinist regimes. This museum serves as a reminder of the gruesome crimes committed during these hard times.

The fact is that the museum is housed in the very building that once was the headquarters of the ÁVH secret police. People were interrogated, tortured and killed here, and so the memory of these victims live on.



Budapest is famous for its moderately priced antiques which you can find in places such as the Falk Miksa utca quarter. One of the most popular Hungarian souvenirs is handmade Herend porcelain, which has been in production since 1828. The beautiful, hand-painted vases, dishes and porcelain have won many gold medals at various world exhibitions. The factory's own shop is on József Nádor square.

Around the corner lies Vörösmarty Square, where you can either gather energy with a cup of coffee and a cream cake at the city's most famous patisserie, Café Gerbeaud, or carry on to the former Luxus department store with the international fashion houses' most famous stores.

The Váciutca pedestrian street between Vörösmarty square and the Market Square is Budapest's largest shopping centre. This is where you will find the international fashion houses' own stores, souvenir shops, wine shops and several galleries. Do not miss the small cross-streets with their sweet little shops and upscale wine merchants. Many Budapest residents think that the prices in this area are too high and instead do their shopping in Pest's gigantic Westend or in the shops in the Great Ring, which is what they call the boulevard around the city centre.

The new, young shops are scattered around the centre on the Pest side. Király Street is being transformed into a

design centre. Do not miss Nagycsarnok on Vámház street, Budapest's great market hall built in 1896, which has everything that Hungary can offer in the way of food. Here you can buy Hungarian specialities such as, for example, the world-renowned Tokay wine Tokaji Aszú. "The wine of kings, the king of wines" – its special flavour is of sweet, overly ripe and shrivelled grapes. A dessert wine which complements cakes and desserts perfectly. On the first floor, they sell high quality Hungarian souvenirs such as cloth, garments etc.



Airport

Budapest's airport, Liszt Ferenc International Airport, lies 16 km south-east of the city. The airport minibus service is very convenient and has a fixed price for transport into the city. The cheapest way is to take bus 200 E from the airport to the Köbánya-Kispest underground railway station, which takes approx. 20 minutes.

Public Transport

Budapest has an underground railway, buses and trams. The Budapest card includes admission to over 60 museums and discounts for sightseeing, swimming, etc.

Budapest has three railway stations: Keleti, Nyugati and Deli, which are linked by the underground railway. The MAV railway company operates between the stations.

65+ EU citizens can get free transport with ID.

Taxi




