THE CITY

Darwin is the administrative capital of the Northern
Territory and is called the capital of tropical Australia
because it is lush and green, full of tropical plants and the
perfume of Frangipanis. The cyclone season is from
November to April, when there are stunning electrical
storms and predictable afternoon rains. The city was
virtually rebuilt after being devastated by cyclone Tracy in
1974.

The Stuart Highway - The Track - is the only road out of town and runs 2,800 km south to Adelaide. Since 2004, Darwin has had a rail link to the great southern cities of Adelaide, Melbourne, Perth, and Sydney. The Ghan passenger train service runs twice a week.

Darwin is no great shakes as a designer shopping venue except in terms of outback necessities and aboriginal artifacts. There are no large department stores, although they can be found in the nearby Casuarina shopping mall. Darwin's main shopping streets are Mitchell Street and the parallel pedestrian precinct of Smith Street.

Mitchell Street is mainly tour excursion shops, cafés, bars, Internet cafés, aboriginal art and artifacts and a few other miscellaneous shops. There is also the air-conditioned Mitchell Street Shopping Mall with stores selling jewellery, mobile phones, clothes, photographic equipment and toys along with Cole's 24 hour supermarket.

The Smith Street pedestrian precinct is a more relaxing retail environment with fountains, outdoor cafés, bookshops, shoe shops and tourist stores. Unique local specialty buys include the rare pink diamonds from the Argyle Diamond mine at Creative Jewelers, south sea pearls from Paspaley Pearls and crocodile fashion accessories (locally farmed) from di Croco.
