THE CITY

Visitors to Cologne will find a modern media city with historic roots. Cologne is the oldest of Germany's large cities and the impressive outline of its cathedral, a Gothic masterpiece and the most visited building in Germany, towers over all the city's other buildings. The cathedral, which was started in 1248, was one of the most ambitious building projects of the Middle Ages and is still one of the largest cathedrals in Europe.

The city began life as a Roman colony, hence the name Colonia, which later became Cologne, or Köln in German. Today Cologne is a metropolis in all senses of the word, both in terms of its size and the attractions it has to offer. It is a centre for the arts with many galleries and innumerable large international trade fairs.

The city's skyline is dominated by the cathedral and twelve Romanic churches, as well as by five large radio and television buildings. Many printing firms and newspaper companies are based in Cologne, which is one of Europe's most important media cities. Visitors will find that the majority of the sights, restaurants and nightclubs in Cologne are located in the city centre, in the Old Town or Altstadt, alongside the ring road around the city and in the Severin district to the south.

Cologne's location on the Rhine makes it the perfect starting place for romantic trips down the river. Amongst the more modern architectural sights, the Neo-Gothic

building on Glockenstrasse is the most popular with visitors. This is where the city's most famous product, Eau de Cologne 4711, was originally made.



The Cathedral Of St. Peter and Maria

Work on building the cathedral began in 1248 and it was the largest building project undertaken in the Middle Ages. A large, spacious church was needed to accommodate the influx of pilgrims who came to visit one of the most important shrines in the Catholic Church, which holds the relics of the three wise men. The bones are kept in a casket which is the most precious treasure in the cathedral: a masterpiece of the medieval goldsmith's art.







Shopping in Cologne is easy nearly everything is within walking distance. We suggest starting at the Hauptbahnhof (main station), going past the cathedral and walking on southwards down Hohe Strasse as far as Cäcilienstrasse. This will give you a good overview of most of what the city has to offer. This long pedestrian area has shops selling clothes, technology, souvenirs, cosmetics, books and music. You'll find clothes chains such as Mango and Zero, but also the Kaufhof department store.

Breite Strasse is a side street off Hohe Strasse and has an interesting mix of shops. The new DuMont Carré and Opernpassage – or WDR arcade – has more exclusive labels and products.

Schildergasse runs south from the opera house to the Neumarkt.

A new shopping area has grown up here which runs westwards to Rudolfstrasse, with the Bazaar de Cologne shopping mall. The Belgisches Viertel – the Belgian district around Brüsseler Platz (U-Bahn Rudolfplatz) – is well-known for new, young fashion. Here you'll find trendy clothes, jewellery and designer labels.

Just outside the city centre is the arts centre Hof 242. A former glass factory has been converted into an exclusive exhibition and sales centre for artists and designers covering an area of 2000 square metres. Here you'll find






