THE CITY

Marmaris has grown from a tiny fishing village into one of the biggest tourist resorts in Turkey. Even so, the town centre is still quite small, and in the old quarter behind the marina, you can stroll around amid all the delightful hustle and bustle of bazaars and street life. For a beautiful view of the Bay of Marmaris, visit Suleiman the Magnificent's castle in the Old Town.Marmaris' neighbouring resort, Icmeler, lies just a few miles away, and many people like to walk along the beach, which will also give you an idea of how much is happening in the boat scene, and the wide range of water sports available along the beaches. But while Marmaris offers more buzz and entertainment, Içmeler boasts better beaches. It is also child-friendly, and newly built. Turkey's rich and famous tend to congregate in the marina at Marmaris, which means there are good restaurants and great shopping. During the high season, there are as many as ten thousand boats in the Bay of Marmaris, reckoned to be one of the finest bays in the world. There are several excellent long-distance footpaths in the mountains, and many opportunities for excursions amid the beautiful scenery and the little villages along the coast.

DO & SEE

Fort

The little fort dating from 1522, has been restored and is worth a visit, though the most remarkable aspect is still the view of Marmaris. The museum has various fragments from antiquity, and some rusty mediaeval cannon.

Datça Peninsula

The road across the Datça peninsula has stunning scenery, with steep mountains, ravines and flat countryside. Datça is an attractive village about 90 km west of Marmaris. From Körmen, just north of Datça, there are boats to Bodrum. At the Saturday market in Datça you will find food, household utensils, beautiful tablecloths and clothes. Take the local bus.

Dalyan/kaunos

Travelling eastward from Marmaris takes you along the Lycian coast – deservedly famous. At the Dalyan River, some 80 kilometres (50 miles) east of Marmaris, are the spectacular rock tombs at Kaunos, and untamed scenery. The Loggerhead turtle comes here to lay its eggs on the beaches. The river's mud is used for packing people in clay, and is regarded as very health-giving. Excursion bus or dolmus



Fethiye

This is a quiet little town, ideal for families, surrounded by fields of fruit and tomatoes. Almynta's tomb – the town's symbol – is here, and nearby there are several Lycian graves. In the market there are small fish counters where you can select the fish you want to eat. One of Turkey's most spectacular beaches, Ölüdeniz (the Dead Sea, meaning the Calm Sea), lies about 25 minutes by bus from Fethiye's centre. Local bus or dolmus.

Patara & Demre

The long and beautiful Patara beach, with its protected sand dunes, is where the sea turtles come to lay their eggs. The ancient town, hidden beneath the sands, is now being excavated. Patara is best known as the birthplace of St Nicholas, who we call Santa Claus – Father Christmas. You can visit his grave at Demre. Local bus or dolmus.

Turkish Bath - Hamam

If you have never taken by Turkish bath, you have never been really clean. It is a real adventure to experience this in a traditional environment. There are separate baths for ladies and gentlemen, but tourists are often allowed to take a mixed bath together.

Pamukkale

This really is one of nature's wonders. There are terraces with pools, and the water runs down from one level to the next in a natural spectacle created by white lime deposits. The name means "The Cotton-wool Fortress."

Unfortunately, too many visitors have created a lot of wear and tear on the cliffs, and now most of the pools are closed to the public. There are daily excursions here, but you can also take the local bus. Travelling time: about 3.5 hours.

Rhodes

The Greek island of Rhodes is a very popular destination for excursions. At the moment the town is undergoing an extensive facelift – churches, monasteries, mosques and mediaeval buildings are being restored to their former glory. Both Unesco and the EU are protecting this unique cultural heritage, as the Old Town – with its winding cobbled streets – is one of Europe's most authentic mediaeval sites. Daily boat trips. Travelling time: about 1 hour.

BEACH LIFE

BEACH LIFEYou can go swimming right in the middle of Marmaris, and the beach stretches all the way to neighbouring lçmeler. There are boats and dolmus to the beaches at Turunç, Çiftlik and Kumlubükü, and many yachts and sailing boats go there as well. Marmaris has several international diving schools. It is also possible to get to the beautiful little island of Sedir Adalari. The sand there is unique, and legend has it that it was brought here by Queen Cleopatra 2,000 years ago. Whether true or not, it is still a beautiful place!

SHOPPING

First, a brief warning: As Marmaris is such a big tourist destination, you have to keep an eye on prices. Some things can cost four times as much as they do elsewhere, for example, in Datça. Be alert for fake versions of branded goods, and check that you can actually change the batteries in the watch. Otherwise, it will just be an expensive throwaway watch. However, pirate don't necessarily mean worse quality than the originals. Haggling is essential, above all when buying carpets. When all that is said and done, it can still be a lot of fun just to wander around the bazaar that stretches over several blocks in the town centre. You will find carpets, leather jackets, pirated designer goods and souvenirs are all kinds. At the market (Thursdays in Marmaris and Fridays in Içmeler) you can buy honey and spices (always worth buying in Turkey). Tablecloths are another good buy. But just browsing around all the stalls without shopping is also quite an experience. These days, the market in Marmaris is a covered market (near the dolmus station and the Tansas department store). In the Netzel shopping mall (Netzel marina), you will find leisure clothes and exclusive designer labels for sailing types. Sometimes called Beverly Hills, because here at Tommy Hilfiger and Lacoste they sell not copies, but the real thing. If you are looking for delicacies, we can recommend a look around Tansas (at Ulusal Egemenlik Bul), a huge department store with a well-stocked food section. They also sell toys, clothes and household goods.

Airport

The Dalaman airport lies about 90 km east of Marmaris. The airport buses only run to coincide with flights, and cost 25 YTL. Be ready: the journey may take around 2 hours. Taxis are expensive, while the local bus stops a couple of kilometres from the airport.

Public transport

The simplest and cheapest way to get about is to take a dolmus, minibuses or large taxis, which depart when they are full and stop where you want. From the Otogar bus station, buses set off for other places in Turkey. It is a good idea to book a seat in advance. Many bus companies run services along the same routes. Reckon on the ticket costing about 4 euro per 100 km. A bus from Marmaris to Istanbul costs about €40.

Taxis

Taxis are yellow and have taxi signs on the roof. They have taximeters with two different rates, so from the hours of midnight and 6 a.m. it will cost up to 50 percent more than during daytime.

Post

Turkish post offices can be recognised by the PTT symbol.

The main Post Office is called in Turkish Merkez

Called Eczanesi in Turkish. In the pharmacy window there will be the address and telephone number of the pharmacy on 24 hour duty.


