THE CITY



Welcome to Nuremberg!

Nuremberg's wealth of sights, delights and highlights means there's always something for residents and visitors of all ages to discover. One of these is the Christkindlesmarkt, the city's most famous event. Year after year, 2.5 million visitors visit one of the world's most beautiful Christmas markets to experience its quaint atmosphere, taste the range of delicacies and listen to the Christmas Angel's opening prologue. The famous Bardentreffen and Blaue Nacht events are well worth a visit too, as is Rock im Park, one of Germany's largest rock festivals

The Sigena Urkunde, a deed published in 1050 by Emperor Henry III, contains the first documented reference to Nuremberg. The Kaiserburg, which was designed as a political and military hub and was one of the key imperial palaces of the Middle Ages, is still the city's main landmark. Nuremberg's appointment as an Imperial City put it under direct control of the Emperor and it enjoyed a number of privileges as a result. But the city also became known for its many scholars and artists, such as the painter Albrecht Dürer, one of the city's most famous residents.

Nuremberg's unusual affinity with the crafts eventually made it one of the key trading towns in the Middle Ages. In more recent times, Nuremberg gained a less favourable reputation for itself during the National Socialist era. Even today, parts of the city are still home to gigantic ruins representing the Nazi regime's deluded notion of grandeur.

After the city was virtually razed to the ground in the Second World War, the decision was made to start rebuilding the historical Old Town to reflect its original glory. Along with neighbouring towns Fürth, Erlangen and Schwabach, the city today makes up the metropolitan area of Nuremburg.

The city's rambling shopping streets, vast green spaces, art and culture attract visitors to the city the whole year round.

The Kaiserburg



Dominating the city skyline, you can't fail to notice it: the Kaiserburg. At the time of the Holy Roman Empire, the castle was occasionally home to each of the emperors, and

in the Middle Ages, it was one of the most important royal palaces. The sights here include the new castle museum, the palace with the emperor's living quarters, the Romanesque Double Chapel, the Deep Well and the Sinwell Tower. The neighbouring garden is a must-see too. It might be small, but it's a welcome contrast to the hustle and bustle of the city and is popular with residents too.

Main Market Square, Church of Our Lady and Beautiful Fountain



The large market square located at the heart of the city centre is surrounded by a multitude of must-see sights. The daily market takes place here too, where you can buy

all sorts of tasty treats, flowers and spices. The ornate Beautiful Fountain is a well-photographed sight. The two rings on the fence are the focus of much attention. A legend says that if you turn the "golden ring" and make a wish, it will come true. The black ring, meanwhile, is said to bless women with children. The main market square is characterised by the facade of the Chruch of Our Lady constructed as an imperial royal chapel. Every day at noon the "Männleinlaufen" (mechanical clock and glockenspiel) takes place here - a daily event not to be missed!

Albrecht-Dürer's House



The Albrecht-Dürer-Haus is one of the most famous museums and exhibitions in Nuremberg. Between 1509 and 1528, it was Albrecht Dürer's home and workplace.

Today, the building is both a memorial and a museum. The rooms feature period furnishings, and visitors can see a demonstration of the printing procedure used in Dürer's lifetime in one of the bedrooms. The top floor, meanwhile, showcases copies of the artist's works. The museum houses a variety of temporary exhibitions featuring original works. We highly recommend taking the guided tour with Agnes Dürer, wife of the famous artist. She gives a faithful account of what life was like 500 years ago.

Documentation Centre Nazi Party Rally Grounds



Even today, the former Reichsparteitagsgelände (Nazi Party Rally Grounds) in the south of the city is still home to gigantic ruins representing the Nazi regime's deluded

notion of grandeur. The 11 km2 complex was where the Nazi Party orchestrated its propaganda campaign. The documentation centre is located in the north wing of the Kongresshalle, which was designed by the Nazis to hold 50 000 people and was never completed. The permanent "Faszination und Gewalt" ("Fascination and Terror") exhibition housed in the 1300 m² venue, chronicles the causes, relationships and consequences of the Nazi dictatorship.

Year after year, on the friday before the first advent, Germany's most famous christmas market opens for the public. The historical surroundings of the

Nuremberg main market square with the Church of Our Lady and the view of St. Lorenz and St. Sebald, the two Gothic churches in the Old Town, lend the Christkindlesmarkt its special charm. The stalls convey the unique look and feel of the market and visitors can look forward to the traditional offering of Lebkuchen (German gingerbread), Nuremberg sausages and mulled wine. The opening ceremony is an impressive experience for all, as the Nuremberg Christkind stands on the gallery of the Church of Our Lady and delivers the famous opening prologue at 5.30 pm precisely.

Handwerkerhof




A sight with special flair.

Historic Rock-Cut Cellars



An extensive labyrinth of underground passageways and cellar vaults has existed in the bedrock of castle hill for centuries - the Historic Rock-Cut Cellars. As early as

1380 red beer was stored in the subterranean cellars, sometimes comprising four levels, that had been cut into the Burgsandstein (local Nuremberg sandstone). During the air raids of World War II many citizens found shelter in these historical vaults.

St. Sebald Church



Nuremberg's oldest town church St. Sebald dates back to approx. the year 1215. The church is located underneath the Imperial Castle and contains important works of

art such as the imposing 4.17 meter high tomb built by the artist Peter Vischer - the bones of Nuremberg's patron saint Sebaldus are presumed to rest here. The famous Nuremberg painter Albrecht Dürer was baptized and got married there. Destroyed during World War II, St. Sebald was reconstructed in 1957.

St. Lawrence Church



The beautiful St. Lawrence Church is tucked away at the heart of the Nuremberg pedestrian area. Built in 1250, it has been an Evangelical Lutheran church since 1525.

The church has a magnificent west facade with a splendid

portal richly decorated with statuary and a huge rose window (mid 14th century). Reconstruction work on the church started in 1952 following severe damage during the World War II.

Friedhof St. Johannis



The Friedhof St. Johannis is one of Europe's most important cemeteries, as a number of famous personalities, such as Albrecht Dürer and Veith Stoss, are

buried here. A very beautiful place, it is also known as the "Cemetery of Roses" as a result of the many roses that grow on the site. The cemetery was commissioned as a result of the advanced council order that no longer permitted burials to be performed within the city walls. A new cemetery therefore had to be built in the surrounding area for both halves of the city. Why not visit the baroque Hesperidengärten afterwards?

Without a shadow of doubt, Nuremberg's most famous food export is the Nürnberger Rostbratwurst. No bigger than your finger, you can order 6, 8, 10 or 12 of these sausages, which are in most cases served with sauerkraut or potato salad. If you're feeling a bit peckish in between meals, why not try a "3 im Weckla" (3 sausages in a roll), which is generally garnished with mustard. Or if you're in the mood for a hearty meal, how about sampling the delights on Franconian menus, which traditionally include "Schäuferle mit Kloss und Soss" (roasted pork shoulder with dumplings and gravy) or Sauerbraten (marinated beef). You can't come to Nuremberg and not try the local delicacies!


