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THE CITY

This pearl of the Mediterranean is a mini continent in its own right. Mallorca's varied scenery has made the island a dream place for filmmakers and advertisers. You can see the variety for yourself through the windshield of your hired car.

Within 20 minutes, you can drive from the capital Palma to sensationally beautiful Valldemossa in the mountains to the northwest—the village where the composer Frederic Chopin lived with his sweetheart, the authoress George Sand. Drive another 10 minutes, and you are in the village of Deià, former home of the poet Robert Graves.

If you go southeast of Palma, you will find a picturesque fishing idyll and magnificent fjord-like bays near the village of Portopetro, 45 minutes away. A slice of the West Indies in Mallorca—the vast beach of Es Trenc—lies a few miles to the west.

Head north, toward Capdepera, and you will be amazed by the mediaeval castle built over a crumbled city wall. Golden sandy beaches are flanked by lofty mountains straight out of "The Fellowship of the Ring." The golf courses gleam, and the sea is its deepest turquoise. Everywhere there are forts, monasteries, beautiful beaches, treasures, myths and legends.

This Island has an amazing nature and is a true paradise for relaxation without needing to spend a fortune. Visit the beautiful La Seu Cathedral, enjoy the turquoise water or go wine testing in Binissalem Wine Village.

Palma

The fishing nets put out to dry on the quayside glisten brightly in Mediterranean blue. Behind the nets you can catch sight of the stock exchange building La Lonja, dating from 1388. During the Middle Ages, the place where local people are now drinking coffee was where most of the Mediterranean area's trade was handled. As early as 123 BC the Romans christened this town with the name Palmaria. Later, the name given to Palma by the Moors—Medina Mayurka—became the name for the whole island.

Casco Antiguo – Old Town

You can hear echoes of previous centuries in the lanes and alleyways of the Old Town. Take a stroll around one of the largest areas of ancient buildings in Europe, cast your eyes over the spruced-up palaces and visit the designer hotels and bars.

Do not miss La Seu Cathedral, dating from 1231, with its fantastic wrought-iron canopy by the architect Gaudí. This

is the only cathedral in the world facing Mecca. King Jaume 1 used one of the old Moorish mosque minarets as the clock tower for his building.

Monastery at Valldemossa

High mountains and deep valleys frame Valldemossa, the village where the island's two first "celebrity tourists" – the composer Frederic Chopin and the authoress George Sand – lived in 1838. At the monastery, all the cells for the monks are in a row, each with its own exit to the garden terrace with blossoming magnolias and a wonderful view over the valley.

Formentor

Dizzying twisting roads and dramatic cliffs, north-west Mallorca is wild and beautiful. People crowd the vantage points along the road, and take photographs with goose bumps on their arms.

Sineu

In Mallorca's centre lies the oldest village of all, Sineu, where the King once lived. Being right at the centre of the island meant there was a chance of getting away if the island was over taken by pirates. For over a thousand years, farmers have been coming here with their cows, bulls, horses, sheep, dogs, asses, mules, ducks, hens and

swans to market each Wednesday.

Soller

The inhabitants of Soller lived for centuries hidden in a valley behind a huge row of mountains. It was so hard to climb the mountain chain that people preferred to go to Palma by boat. And if they were on a boat anyway, why not go to France? Soller became tri-lingual—Mallorcan, Spanish and French. In 1911 a tunnel was dug through the mountains, so finally the people of Soller could get in touch with their own island. The wonderful little train is still there today.

Cala d'Or is a medium sized and cosy beach resort located 65 kilometres east of Palma. The city has seven picturesque bays where you can enjoy the sun and beach. Cuevas del Drach

Cuevas del Drach is an impressive sight and offers beautiful caves. It is located around 65 kilometres from Palma in an old fishing village called Porto Cristo. This is one of the most outstanding tourist attractions on Mallorca. The caves are two kilometres long and thousands upon thousands of amazing stalagmites and stalactites are spread across the three chambers called Cueva Negra, Cueva Blanca and Cueva Luis Salvator. Palma is a great place for shopping. Two areas are especially handy – next to the huge Corte Inglés department store near Plaza España, or next to the old city centre by the little Corte Inglés on Jaime III. The broad avenues around Plaza España have everything from local curio shops selling tin soldiers, to specialists selling Serrano ham.

Ladies who want to buy clothes head for the large Corte Inglés store, where Mango, Zara, Bershka, Stradivarius, Women's Secret and all the other boutiques lie cheek by jowl. More exciting, and packed with small boutiques and designer names, is the area behind Bar Bosch right opposite the H&M shop in central Palma by Plaza Joan Carlos I.

The best market is to be found in Sineu on Wednesdays. If you are short of time and want to see everything, then head for the shopping centre in Porto Pi in Palma. There you will find 50 shops—including Zara, Mango and Massimo Dutti and Zara Interiors.
