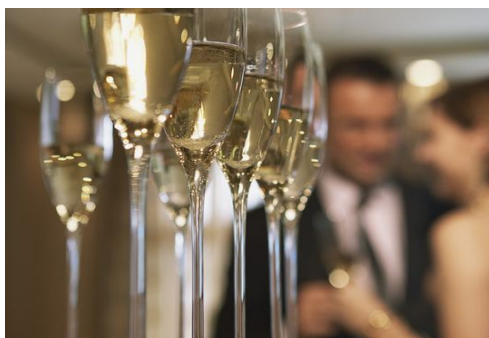
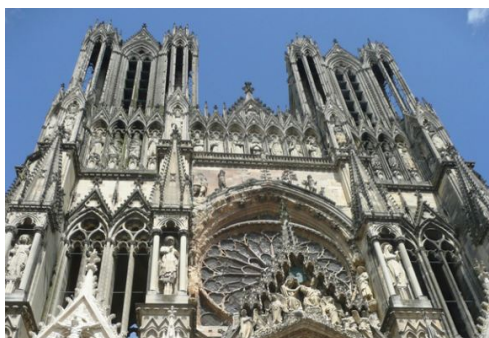

THE REGION



The Champagne Ardenne region

Paris-Vatry airport is located in the heart of the Champagne Region, 150km to the east of Paris. Steeped in history and culture, and home to the vineyards of the world-famous wine, Champagne offers a sparkling blend of heritage and nature that will entice and enchant you. The majestic city of Reims, where a long line of French kings were crowned, is renowned for its magnificent gothic cathedral, one of 4 UNESCO world heritage sites, and prestigious champagne houses. Other towns include Epernay, with its famed Avenue of Champagne, Châlons-en-Champagne, criss-crossed with rivers and parks, and medieval Troyes with its half timbered houses and narrow, paved streets. Outside the towns, the vineyards and fields are dotted with pretty villages offering many places of interest such as a champagne museum housed in a lighthouse, a tree-top champagne bar, the artist studio of Renoir, the family home of Charles de Gaulle and a visitors' centre dedicated to the great General. For history-lovers, the impressive medieval fortress of Sedan in the Ardennes is the largest of its kind in Europe, and the many sites connected to the Great War include battlefields, trenches, museums and memorials. To relax and rejuvenate, take your pick from a wide choice of outdoor leisure activities.

Other places to taste include C Comme..., a champagne bar at Epernay with over 400 different kinds of champagne, or for an original location try the Perchingbar, a champagne bar up a tree in the forest behind Verzy! First World War Museums

DINING



Specialties

To the east of Paris, you will discover a traditional and gourmet cuisine in Seine-and-Marne and Champagne that will tempt all palates! Look out for:

Cheese: Brie from Meaux, Melun and Provins, Coulommiers, Chaource and Langres (both soft, cows-milk cheeses) and a whole array of other cheeses made from cow-, goat- and ewe-milk.

Charcuterie and pork products: White sausage from Rethel (le Boudin Blanc de Rethel), traditionally made from fresh pork meat, milk and eggs Cured Ardennes Ham (le Jambon Sec des Ardennes), produced from fresh pork thigh with spices and aromatics Reims Ham (le Jambon de Reims), cooked with parsley, very tender with a refined taste Troyes Chitterlings sausage (l'Andouillette de Troyes), made from pork intestines and seasoned with fresh onion, salt, pepper and spices pigs trotters from Sainte-Memehould (Pieds de Porc à la Sainte Menehould), served breaded and having a very smooth and tender texture.

Mustard: The famous 'Pommery' mustard from Meaux, appreciated by gourmets throughout the world the 'Clovis' range of mustards from Reims – traditional (à l'ancienne), grape (moût de raisin), tarragon (estragon), tomato etc.

Truffles from Champagne: black on the outside, with a chocolate-brown flesh flecked with white veins, the aroma of this 'grey diamond' is delicate with hints of hazelnut coming through in the taste.

Traditional sweet specialties: Briard shortcake (les Sablés Briards), delicious butter biscuits from the Brie area, flavoured with apple or cider Réau macaroons (les Macarons fondants de Réau), small, traditional cakes, crunchy on the outside and soft-centred, available in many different flavours (hazelnut, almond, chocolate, pistachio, coffee, vanilla, poppy etc) Reims pink biscuits (le biscuit rose de Reims), flavoured with vanilla and traditionally dipped into a glass of champagne Reims spiced bread (le pain d'épices de Reims), made from a traditional recipe and available in four different varieties – fondant, traditional (à l'ancienne), honey (pur miel) or finely peppered (finement poivré), recommended to accompany foie gras Sugar pastry (la Galette au Sucre), a speciality of the Ardennes.

Other sweetmeats: Poppy specialities from Nemours – liqueurs, jellies, syrups, flavoured chocolates etc Rose specialities from Provins – candied rose petals, traditional sweets, rose-flavoured honey, chocolates, liqueurs, jellies and other rose delicacies Champagne corks (les bouchons de Champagne), liqueur chocolates in the form of a champagne cork and filled with ‘marc de Champagne’ barley sugars from Moret-sur-Loing which were a favourite in the Royal French Court.

Beer, cider and fresh apple juice from the Brie region, pays d’Othe near Troyes and the Ardennes.
