THE CITY

Perugia was an Etruscan settlement between 6th-1st century BC, falling to the Romans in 40 BC. The quantity and quality of remains from these periods is impressive, particularly the ancient walls and gates to the city, many of which remain intact. One of Perugia's charms is the merging of ancient and modern, for example, here you can walk under giant stone arches constructed 2,000 years ago or shop in a modern department store.

Another of its charms is its size: the historic centre is small enough to walk around in half a day – though, add in all the galleries and museums of note, and you have enough to keep you busy for a long weekend. Ask at the tourist office for a leaflet detailing walking itineraries round the city.

Galleria Nazionale Dell Umbria

Housed in the Palazzo dei Priori, the gallery has an extensive collection of art, both Umbrian and national, from the 13th through to the 19th centuries. There is a sizeable collection of work by the local painter, Pietro Vannucci, who was more commonly called Perugino.

Palazzo dei Priori

This is a beautiful medieval structure, first built at the end of the 13th century, and the subject of many additions and alterations over the years. Head up the stairs in Piazza IV Novembre and into the Sala dei Notari – completely covered in allegorical and biblical frescoes that date from the 13th century.

Entering the palazzo from Corso Vannucci takes you to the Galleria Nazionale dell'Umbria and to two further rooms: the Collegio della Mercanzia and the Collegio del Cambio. The Collegio della Mercanzia is beautifully panelled in wood, probably done by German craftsmen in the 15th

century. The Collegio del Cambio has two rooms, the second with stunning late 15th century frescoes by Perugino.

Piazza IV Novembre

Piazza IV Novembre was the main square of the Etruscan city, and the Roman Forum. In medieval Perugia, it was the point at which the five principal roads crossed and even today it is at the heart of Perugia. As an open-air venue it can't be beaten: in the summer, thousands of people gather here to enjoy the Umbria Jazz Festival.

Fontana Maggiore

This fountain, between the cathedral and the Palazzo dei Priori, is considered to be one of the best examples of its kind in existence. It was constructed around 1275 by father-and-son sculptors from the city of Pisa.

Oratory of San Bernardino

Built in honour of Saint Bernadino of Siena, this tiny church has a very pretty façade. Aqua, rose and white in colour, with sculpture and bas-reliefs, the façade was finished in 1461. The interior has been modernised, though have a look at the altar— it's made from a 4th-century sarcophagus and contains the remains of Beato Egidio, one of St Francis of Assisi's friars.

Church of San Severo

The 11th century church of San Severo (Cappella di San Severo) was built on the site of a pagan temple. Rebuilt in the 18th century, it is noteworthy for the fresco in its 14th century chapel: the upper part is by the great Renaissance painter Raphael, the lower part by Perugino.

Church of Sant'agata

This is a delightful little church that dates back to the 12th century but was rebuilt in the 1317. Here you find many examples of early 14th century frescoes and other paintings and work of art made by Umbrian painters.

Tempio di San Michele Arcangelo (chiesa Di Sant'angelo)

This is one of the oldest churches in Italy – dating from the 5th century AD. Strange symbols and references to the Knights Templar can be seen, as well as the symbol of the pentagram near the church entrance. This is a must-see.

Etruscan Arches

Six of the seven original Etruscan arches into the city can still be seen, with Roman, Medieval and Renaissance alterations. Take a walk around the city following the original walls – the tourist office in Piazza Matteotti has a leaflet with suggested routes.

Church of San Pietro

Church of San Pietro is a beautiful Benedictine abbey, originally founded in the 10th century. The church has some fine 15th and 16th century architecture, a good collection of Renaissance art, including frescoes and paintings by Raphael, Vasari, Vassillacchi, Perugino and Parmigiano and possibly the best wooden choir (16th century) in Italy.

Corciano

Corciano is a hilltop village around 13 km north of Perugia.

With Etruscan-Roman origins, it's been named as one of the most beautiful villages in Italy. Bus no.87 runs every hour from Piazza Italia to Corciano. It takes around 50 minutes.

Umbria is full of beautiful hilltop towns and villages, though Assisi, the birthplace of St Francis, has to be one of the best known. There is a regular bus service (line E007) from the Perugia main bus terminal. Journey time is around 50 minutes.

This museum is housed in a former convent next to the church of San Domenico. It has an extensive archaeological collection including a lot of etruscan artifacts. This place is a must for everyone with the slightest interest of history.

DINING

Hearty recipes involving pork (try porchetta alla perugina/ roast sucking pig), olive oil, truffles and great pasta dishes are the hallmarks of Umbrian cuisine. Perugia is full of restaurants, many of them so small that reservations are essential. The snack of choice in Perugia is pizza – all over town there are tiny takeaway pizzerias serving pizza by the slice.

The principal shopping street in Perugia is the wide, pedestrianised Corso Vannucci, along with the streets that run off it and parallel to it: Piazza Matteotti, Via C. Fani, Via Baglioni, Via Oberdan. Perugia in general and Corso Vannucci in particular, have many fashion and shoe stores, including some well-known designer names like Max Mara. Pick up some lingerie at Intimissimi – an Italian chain – or try Calzedonia for smalls and funky, well-priced tights.

The department store, Coin, located just off Piazza della Repubblica, has a good selection of fashion and accessories. In Piazza Danti, just north of Piazza IV Novembre, there is the tiniest store imaginable selling a range of stationary and paper products. For some painted ceramics as a souvenir, head to L'Arte dei Vasai on Via Baglioni or Il Pozzo della Ceramiche (Via dei Priori 70). Also on Via dei Priori is Lunatico (no.22), which stocks the Erbolario range of natural beauty products.

As a university town, it's no surprise that Perugia has some good book stores: even if you're not buying, Italian book stores are great for browsing. La Libreria (Via Oberdan 52), has a huge range of books and is open on Sundays, 10.30-13.00 and 16.00-20.00.

Airport San Francesco d'Assisi

The international airport of Umbria – Perugia "San Francesco d'Assisi", lies in the tiny town Sant'Egidio, about 12 km from Perugia city.

There is a bus stop just outside the terminal and from here you can take bus number E007 or E422 (Umbria Mobilità) to Perugia. If you buy the ticket before boarding it costs €1,90 and on the bus the price is € 3,00. If you choose to buy the ticket on board the bus you must have the exact change though.

There is also a shuttle bus service (ACAP-SULGA) running according to airline departure and arrival times. The 20-minute trip costs €8,00 one-way.

A taxi will cost around €20.

Public Transport

The historic heart of Perugia is made for walking, though, expect to go uphill and downhill regularly. If you need a bus, most buses stop at Piazza Italia, where there's an information kiosk where you can also buy tickets. If you buy your ticket before entering the bus it costs €1 for 70 minutes within the city. If you buy it on the bus the price is €1,50. Do not forget to validate your ticket upon boarding. Different prices apply if you're taking a bus out of town. The main bus station is at Piazza Partigiani.

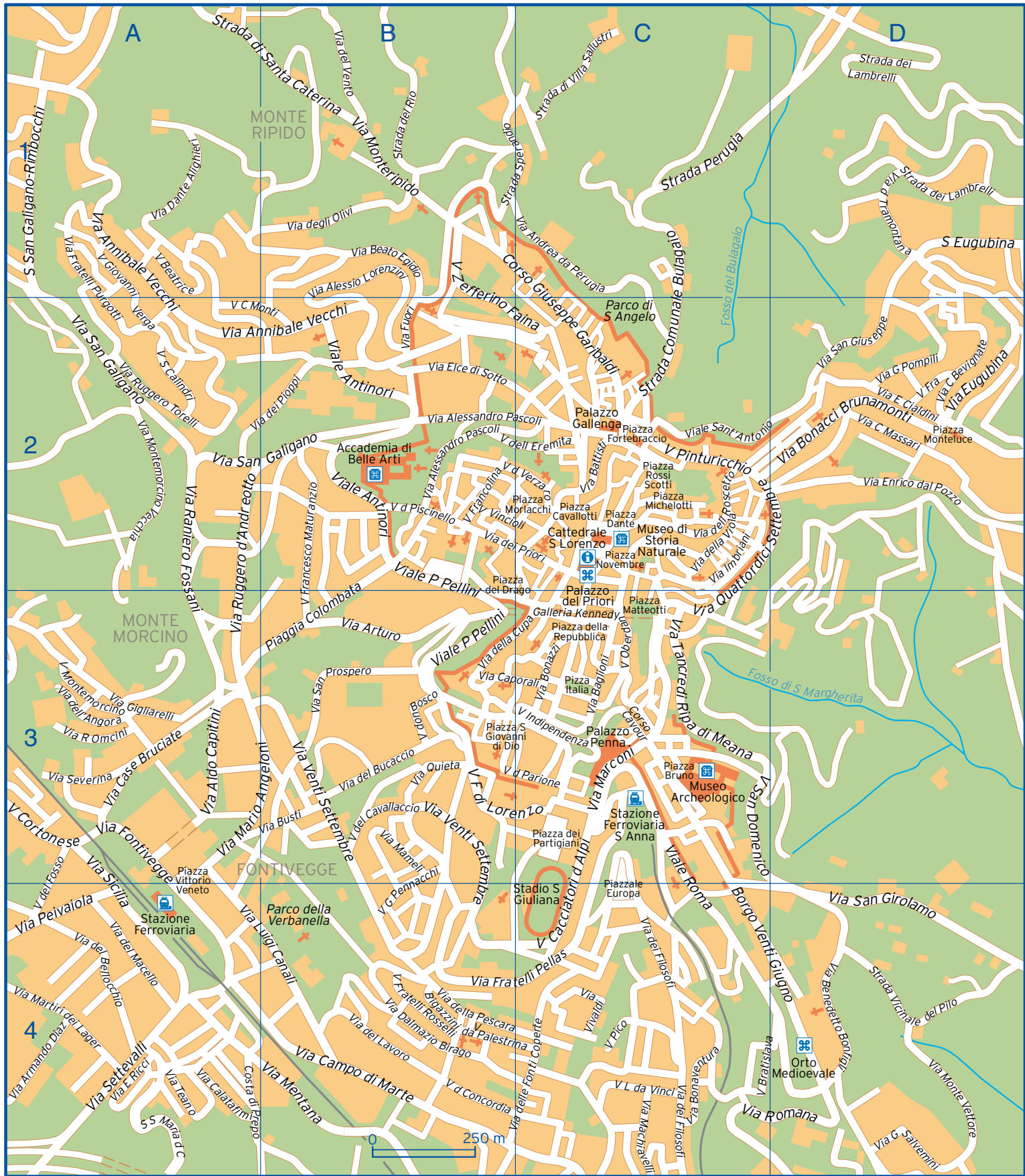
